Teaching Apiary News:

The teaching meetings at the apiary started at the end of April, as part of the successful beginner's weekend. At that stage, we had 2 hives with laying queens, but more colonies have been made during the season.



Since then, meetings have been held every fortnight, with an extra meeting on Monday the 19th June. This was arranged as part of the Northern Region Bee Inspectors programme to check local apiaries in the aftermath of the outbreak of American Foulbrood last September.

At this meeting, the Bee Inspectors demonstrated how to examine frames for signs of foulbrood and Small Hive Beetle, followed by an informal chat over tea. (see report & photo in next column)

As well as meetings for members, the apiary has hosted some visits from the St Bees cubs.

The apiary garden continues to develop. Although we have had some problems with rabbits, the rabbit-resistant plants are spreading and doing very well.
